### Context

Since March 21st, armed military actions have cause the influx of Venezuelan migrants into Arauquita (in the region of Arauca) at the Colombian-Venezuelan border. Armed actions have repeatedly occurred, within the framework of a military operation carried out by the Bolivarian National Air Force - FANB - against an Organized Criminal Group -GDO-I in the town of La Victoria, municipality of Páez, Apure state (Venezuela), which borders Arauquita. These armed actions have caused the massive displacement of more than 5.834 people who have found a safe place to stay in Colombia, considering that they are being affected by three parallel emergency situations: forced migration, armed conflict, and the COVID-19 emergency.

## **Needs** assessment

In Arauquita there is not a sufficient response capacity to attend the current emergency and meet the basic needs of families.

The flowing needs have been identified by the GIFMM Local Coordination group:

- Protection: Especially through a differential humanitarian attention to indigenous, LGTBI, and highly vulnerable communities (children and pregnant and lactating mothers).
- Education: Access, permanence and quality.
- Nutrition and food security
- Water and basic sanitation
- Health: Mitigation of the spread of COVID-19 and mental health support.
- CASH transfers.
- Humanitarian assistance: Shelter kits, clothing, and household items.

#### Coordination

The Arauquita Emergency has been coordinated with all local organizations. We belong to the:

- Local GIFMM
- Specific Protection coordination group and Child Protection sub-group (mesa)
- Co-leadership of the WASH coordination group
- EiE coordination group.
- Co-leadership of in the GTM mechanism (monetary transfers working group).
- PMU (Coordination mechanism with local government and cooperation organizations).



## **Our Response**

We have been in the region of Arauca since 2018. We have been permanently in Arauquita since March 2021 and for two uninterrupted weeks we have attended this emergency with a team of psychologists, community mobilizers, social workers, health workers and specialists in water and basic sanitation.



**Child Protection** We have carried out a psychological first-aid care strategy, where we specifically focus on post-traumatic stress.

We have also developed other socio-emotional learning activities and delivered specific kits according to children's needs. Several protection committees were formed voluntarily and spontaneously among the leaders of each of the shelters that the staff visited, who were trained in risk management and activation of protection routes.

As co-leaders of the WASH working group, we were able to work with the region's family compensation fund (CONFIAR), which allowed a quick and timely access to space of storage. Furthermore, the WASH team carried out an evaluation of the existing infrastructure for emergency care in shelters and the characterization of the population for the delivery of WASH kits.
